What is a DRI EDIA Champion?

- Works with the Alliance to promote and facilitate access to national Alliance DRI services within the research community to members of equity-seeking groups.
- Spends approximately 3 hours a week on average on all activities over the duration of the project term.



An applicant must...

be member of an equity-seeking group <i>OR</i> an individual with a well-thought-out strategy to reach out to an equity- seeking group.	be a graduate or post-graduate researcher enrolled at a Canadian university <i>OR</i> a student enrolled at a Canadian college, CÉGEP, institute or polytechnic engaged in applied research with industry or community partners.	
identify a mentor from their institution	be affiliated with an eligible Canadian	
or audience community, who agrees	institution and must maintain such an	

to provide support with the EDIA aspect of the project.

affiliation for the duration of the award period.

Eligible Canadian institutions.

- Post-secondary institutions (universities, colleges, CEGEP, institute or polytechnic)
- Research hospitals
- Non-profit organizations that are positioned within the DRI ecosystem



Eligible activities.

- Training/mentoring
- Promoting/advancing DRI
- Addressing disciplinary challenges
- Driving culture change
- Informing future initiatives
- Other: will be considered



Award details.

Up to \$35,000

(\$27,000 stipend + \$5,000 project implementation costs + \$3,000 for travel costs)

Equitable access to tools like those found within the Alliance DRI can empower researchers to lead, share knowledge and drive discovery. This project is part of the Alliance's 2023–25 digital research infrastructure (DRI) investments, with the goal of increasing awareness and uptake of the Alliance's DRI by equity-seeking groups. This call for proposals is open to graduate or post-graduate researchers who: · Are affiliated with an eligible Canadian institution, including universities or colleges, CÉGEP, institutes or polytechnics engaged in applied research with industry or community partners; Self-identify as a member of an equity-seeking group AND/OR have relevant expertise in EDIA with a strategy to reach an equity-seeking group; and Will propose a new project to promote the awareness and uptake of Alliance DRI to an equity-seeking audience. The pilot program will award \$35,000 per successful applicant ("DRI EDIA Champion") to support their project.
